Academic Information

Varsity Scholar Certificates:

Presented for academic work each year at the opening of school. Students must have a 4.0 GPA for final grades and have no grade lower than a B. If a student earns a certificate each year, he/she will receive a Lamp of Knowledge Award as a senior the evening of the Senior Awards.

National Honor Society:

Students are considered for the National Honor Society as juniors and again as seniors. Students must have a 4.0 GPA in order to be eligible to apply. Academically qualified students are invited to apply for the Society in December. A faculty committee makes the final selections based on the criteria of character, scholarship, leadership and service.

Graduation with Honors:

Students who graduate with Honors by achieving a 3.6 GPA for the four years receive gold tassels to wear at graduation.

Athletic Information

All SHS teams are under the direction of the Athletic Director, David Pignone. Each team has its own coach and the varsity coach is responsible for all sub-varsity coaches and teams. In general, teams practice or play each day, including Saturday. Practices are mandatory unless excused in advance by the coach. Work commitments are generally not an acceptable reason to miss practice.

PLAYERS MAY NOT PRACTICE OR PLAY IF THEY HAVE BEEN ABSENT FROM SCHOOL.

In some cases, e.g. college interviews, absences may be excused by the Principal or the Vice-Principal and excuses must be presented in advance. Uniforms are provided by the school. Fundraising is limited and no fundraising is mandatory for any player. Questions should be referred to the Athletic Director.
